Association Dues

The 3rd quarter POA dues are due on July 1st. Payments must be <u>received on or</u> before July 10th to avoid penalty charges.

Landscaping Regulations

- 1. No hanging baskets will be allowed anywhere on the buildings.
- 2. Plants and pots are allowed on patios, porches, driveways, and in the beds.



- 3. Only annuals can be planted in existing beds and must be removed at the end of the season.
- 4. If you choose to plant alongside the screened-in porch on an end unit, you may only extend the planting bed 1foot from the building. The mulch must conform to the color mulch used by the landscaper. Beds must be edged and cleaned out at the end of the season.
- 5. Planting along the backside of your unit is allowed, but the width of the bed from the building can be no more than 2 feet. You may plant perennials, annuals, or shrubs, no vegetable plants. Plantings when full grown must not encroach upon lawns for the purpose of lawn mowing. Beds must be mulched with the same color mulch as throughout the development's property and must be edged.
- 6. All vegetables or herbs must be planted in pots and be kept on the back patio.
- 7. It is very important to note that all resident plantings are the sole responsibility of the resident and not the landscaper or the association. Neither of these two parties will be held responsible for any damage.
- 8. We ask that all residents please help by watering shrubs and lawns as needed.
- 9. ** With any new construction all issues regarding the establishment of the landscaping which includes shrubs and lawns are between the resident and the developer for one year from the time of planting. After that the replacement of shrubs will be covered for one additional year by the association. Following the two years, the homeowner is responsible for the replacement and planting. In order to ensure continuity throughout our Abington Woods community, the association will obtain the needed plant(s) and/or shrub(s) for the homeowner from the landscape company providing service at that time. The homeowner will be billed for the purchases. Then there will be two options: (1) the homeowner can do his/her own planting at no additional expense or (2) the planting can be done by the association's landscaper at the homeowner's expense. (**Revised 08/31/2015)

Resale Certificate

Beginning July 1st, the Executive Board will begin providing a Resale Certificate to new buyers, as required by the Planned Community Act.

This is a document that includes our yearly budget information, amount of Association dues, dues seller has paid for during the current year, covenants and by-laws, notice of any outstanding violations and information on any additional landscaping that has been added to the property for which the new buyer is responsible.

The Resale Certificate is a safeguard for both the buyer and the Association. The fee for preparing the document is \$300. Money generated from this fee will be added to the Association budget as revenue.




