Where do my taxes go?



There are three separate taxes levied every year on each property within the county.

- Lackawanna County tax
- South Abington Township tax
- ❖ Abington Heights School District tax

County and Township bills are based on the calendar year. School bills are from July 1st to June 30th in the following year.

Tax bills are mailed to the property owner except in cases where the property is under a mortgage and a mortgage company requests direct mailing of the bill.

The **Lackawanna County** tax bill is issued on or about February 1st, for more information contact the Single Tax office at 570-963-6756 or visit (scrantontaxoffice.org)

The **South Abington Township** tax bill is issued on or about March 1st, for more information contact Scott Thorpe at 570-650-0618.

The **Abington Heights School District** tax bill is issued on or about August 1st, for more information contact Kathy Platt at 570-585-8205 or email plattk@ahsd.org.

According to Pennsylvania law, the County Commissioners, the Township Supervisors and the School District Board of Directors each have independent authority to set the rate of taxation for properties within their boundaries. This rate is expressed in millage. (a mill is equivalent to \$1 of tax for each \$1000 of assessed valuation).

For example, in 2020 the annual taxes on a property assessed at \$20,000 would be:

Other Taxes

A one percent real estate transfer tax is levied on all property sold in the Township. This tax is split evenly between the Township and the School District.

A wage and income tax of one percent is levied annually on the earnings of all persons who reside in the Township. The total amount collected is split evenly between the School District and the Township.

An annual municipal services tax of \$52.00 is levied on all persons working in South Abington Township who earn over \$12,000.00 or more from all combined employers, regardless of their place of residence.

Saturday, October 29th - Ghoulsboro Halloween

Ride the train through the woods to the Gouldsboro train station and museum.

History: The station was built in 1905 when Gouldsboro was originally called Sand Cut, named by the railroad workers for the abundance of sand that was found while constructing the railroad tracks. Later, our town was renamed to Gouldsboro after Jay Gould, an infamous robber baron who built a tannery in this area in 1856, later closing it in 1861 and moving into the business of monopolizing railroads of the west.

Amenities: The station houses a museum, gift shop, covered pavilion, and restrooms; all handicap accessible. Gouldsboro is a CASH-ONLY station and venue with no ATM available, please plan accordingly.

The museum is filled with historical items regarding the railroad and the ice harvesting industry; visitors can stop by the gift shop to purchase gifts, photos, and other items; food will be available to purchase under the covered pavilion. Once you have wrapped up at the station, relax under the pavilion and enjoy the scenery of Snag Pond. Looking to stretch your legs after the train ride? Walk over to Heritage Park and enjoy another view of Snag Pond.

The train ride will last approximately 1 hour; departing Steamtown at 11:00 a.m. and arriving in Gouldsboro at 12:00 p.m. There will be a 2-hour layover at the Gouldsboro Station for the event. Returning train ride will last approximately 1 hour; departing Gouldsboro at 2:00 p.m. and arriving in Steamtown at 3:00 p.m.

Enjoy the fall foliage through the Poconos on the way to Delaware Water Gap!

Upon arrival, visitors will have several hours to explore the nearby village.

This trip is one of the most popular excursion events of the season and seats are expected to fill up quickly.

The Delaware, Lackawanna, and Western Railway (DL&W) first arrived at the Delaware River in 1856 with a train to New York City. The terrain from Scranton had been mountainous and isolated; the route traced the course of major streams, crossed the Lehigh's headwater at Gouldsboro, and bisected Pocono Summit Lake on DL&W's land bridge.

The historic station was built between 1903 and 1904 and designed by Frank J. Nies, an architect best known for having designed numerous DL&W stations. The style of the building is reflective of the Late Victorian Era. The station closed to passenger service in 1953 and was sold to the Borough of Delaware Water Gap in 1958.

Today, The DL&W single track is still in use through the Delaware Water Gap between the river and Route 611. Visitors to Steamtown National Historic Site can enjoy an excursion train reaching Point of Gap Overlook. Just outside Delaware Water Gap's park boundaries, the rail station awaits renewal and can be glimpsed from the Interstate-80 toll plaza westbound.

The train ride will last approximately 3 hours; departing Steamtown at 9 a.m. and arriving in Delaware Water Gap at 12 p.m. There will be a 4-hour layover at the Delaware Water Gap Station to allow folks time to explore the village. Returning train ride will last approximately 3 hours; departing Delaware Water Gap at 4:00 p.m. and arriving in Steamtown at 7:00 p.m.
